R.J. Reynolds High School Class of 1968 Memorial Scholarship

In 1998, the R.J. Reynolds High School Class of 1968 established its Memorial Scholarship, which is awarded annually to a graduating Reynolds senior who is committed to pursuing a bachelor's degree at an accredited college or university.

The idea for the scholarship originated in response to the tragic death of one classmate, Ed Gannaway, who in August 1995, saved many lives but lost his own while heroically piloting a malfunctioning commuter aircraft to the ground. At a meeting of Ed's friends soon after his funeral, one of them suggested establishing a scholarship in his memory to honor Ed's service to others, as shown in both his professional and personal life. As interest in the scholarship spread among other classmates, so did the desire to have it memorialize all deceased members of the Class of 1968, in recognition of the contributions they made during high school and in their communities in subsequent years.

Members of the Class of 1968 manage the scholarship program, including the selection process. The Winston-Salem Foundation administers the scholarship fund and disburses the grants made from it. Since the inception of the program, the Class has selected one recipient per year. Announced at the school's Class Day, the scholarship is a consecutive, four-year renewable award. Currently the scholarship provides \$32,000.00 (\$8,000.00 per year), disbursed to the recipient in equal payments over eight semesters.

Application Procedure

Seniors at R.J. Reynolds High School may apply for the Class of 1968 Memorial Scholarship by obtaining an application packet from the Office of Student Services or by accessing the guidelines and application packet below, or at the website:

The packet to be submitted by an applicant consists of:

- A completed two-page application (form included in this packet.)
- A resume of awards and recognitions, grades 9-12 (form included in this packet.)
- Activities resume (form included in this packet.)
- A financial statement (form included in this packet.)
- An official, signed transcript through the first semester of the senior year.
- A copy of pages 1 & 2 of the most recent household Federal tax return(s), filed by you, your parent(s)/guardian(s) and non-custodial parent. (Please blank out the Social Security numbers on the copies you send.)

Criteria

The Class of 1968 Scholarship Review Committee will use the following, *equally weighted* criteria in evaluating applicants and selecting a recipient for the award:

- Evidence of the potential for distinction at college or university through academic achievement in high school (a minimum, <u>un-weighted</u> grade point average of 3.5).
- Evidence of service to others through school and community activities; include approximate number of volunteer hours contributed to all activities.
- Evidence of financial need as shown on the completed Financial Statement from the application packet and from the most recent U.S. tax return(s) of the applicant, applicant's parent(s)/guardian(s)/where applicable, and non-custodial parent.

The scholarship is available to students regardless of race, sex, national origin, religion, or age.

Selection Process

The Class of 1968 Scholarship Selection Committee will evaluate all completed applications submitted by the deadline and will select the recipient. The committee reserves the right to withhold the award if no applicant meets its qualifications. The Chair of the committee will inform the recipient, the school, and the Foundation. The recipient will be publicly announced at the school's annual Class Day ceremony.

Award of Funds

After the announcement, the Winston-Salem Foundation will provide the recipient with a letter of award explaining the process by which scholarship funds will be disbursed each year. Renewal of the scholarship will be contingent on the recipient's continued enrollment as a full-time student in good standing at an accredited college or university.
